Anne-Marie Gagné-Julien wins 2021 Jaspers Award for her paper “Dysfunction and the Definition of Mental Disorder in the DSM”



Ms. Gagne is a postdoctoral researcher in the Bioethics Unit at McGill University. Her research interests lie at the intersection of the philosophy of psychiatry, psychiatric ethics, the philosophy of science, and social epistemology. Her work in particular focuses on feminist philosophy of science, scientific objectivity in psychiatry, decision-making structures related to psychiatric classification, and epistemic injustices linked to medicalization.

Joseph Houlders receives honorable mention for his paper “Objective Thought and Obsessive-Compulsive Disorder”



Mr. Houlders is currently carrying out AHRC-funded doctoral research at the University of Birmingham where he works across the Philosophy Department and the Institute for Mental Health.
